World day of prayer for the Care of Creation- This day was established in 2015 by Pope Francis. Feast of Mother Teresa of Calcutta- (August 26 1910 – September 5 1997), Mother Teresa, was an Albanian-Indian Catholic nun and the founder of the Missionaries of Charity. This religious congregation grew to have over 4,500 nuns across 133 countries by the year of 2012. This congregation manages homes for people living with HIV/AIDS, leprosy, and tuberculosis. The congregation also runs soup kitchens, dispensaries, mobile clinics, children's and family counselling programs, as well as orphanages and schools.
