## **Parish Highlights**

- St. Margaret of Scotland participated in the Archdiocesan work of All Things New, completing surveys and hosting listening sessions in November. On Pentecost Sunday, Archbishop Rozanski announced that in the reorganization of the Archdiocese, St. Margaret of Scotland would continue as a stand-alone parish with Fr. John Vien remaining as the pastor.
- St. Margaret welcomed many new staff members over the last year, including Orin Johnson as the Director of Music & Liturgy and Michael Sonntag as the Coordinator of Communications. Our school welcomed Theresa Lueke as the Assistant Principal and Gwen Cataldo as the Coordinator of Religious Education.
- Christine Burke bid farewell to St. Margaret of Scotland School after 20 years serving as a teacher, Assistant Principal, and Principal. Patrick Holley will begin as School Principal for the 2023-2024 school year.
- We rejoiced to welcome new Catholics during the Easter season - Matthew Council, Emily Thiele, and Sydney Boesch were received into the Catholic Church after participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.
- Children's Liturgy of the Word returned to the 10am Mass following its Covid cancellation with 7 adult catechists, assisted by teen volunteers, leading sessions for 40-50 children (grades PK-2) each week.
- School children participated in monthly "Class Masses" at the 10am Mass - with each class ministering as Greeters, Offertory, and Sunday Fellowship volunteers.
- Music ministry continues to "restore" itself post covidemergency - highlights of the past year included the Arts & Faith St. Louis Interfaith Concert at the Sheldon and the Feast Day, Christmas, and Holy Week liturgies with around 40 singers and 12 instrumentalists.
- Students in Grades 5 8 participated in a half-day class retreat led by our Coordinator of Religious Education.
  In January, we returned to All School Masses led by individual classes.
- St. Margaret of Scotland held the First Annual SMOS Day of Service, with parishioners and school families





coming out to help clean up the facilities, spruce up the grounds, plant flower beds, prepare meal kits for Operation Food Search, and finish with a parking lot party featuring the Balkan Treat Box food truck.

- SMOS School was awarded a grant through One Classroom to continue their efforts toward inclusive education. The grant award supports a paraprofessional and includes training for the teachers and assistant teachers.
- The SMOS PTA brought in just under \$150,000 from fundraisers, sales, and donations to utilize around the school for various activities, including the Back To School picnic, Pizza Lunch, the Library, Dine Out Nights, Room Parents and class parties, Trivia Night, staff happy hours and holiday party, Spiritwear, Teacher Grants, Family Dance, Fish Fry, and new family welcomes and mentors.
- The St. Margaret community joined together for a night of fun and fundraising at the semi-annual auction benefitting the parish school, DragonFest, which included a live concert with the Mighty Pines (featuring SMOS alum, Neil Salsich).
- Our St. Vincent de Paul Society has been partnering with Isaiah 58 Ministries to supply utility assistance for their clients in exchange for food for our clients. This year, SVdP has made 132 home visits and provided \$13,395 in rental assistance, \$19,650 for Spire Gas assistance, and \$35,520 for Ameren Electric assistance.
- The Living Justice Ministries oversaw the return of the Advocacy Table; presented "Unclouding our Past", a researched study of racism in the Archdiocese; arranged two Welcome Neighbor dinners; held the second annual Walk or Ride to Church on Earth Day weekend; hosted a Spring social for our LGBTQ+ friends and allies; and provided numerous gun violence prevention activities and events to raise awareness and advocate within the parish.
- Youth Ministry saw its weekly Bible study grow from 4 to 16 regular attendees, monthly formation nights were attended by an average of 10 kids each month, two overnight retreats were hosted for 26 students, and 6 students took advantage of a week-long service trip in conjunction with Catholic Heart Work Camp.

#### **Financial Highlights**

- Unrestricted Weekly Giving increased by 1.8% over last year; however, Total Unrestricted Giving dropped by 12.1% as last year included an unrestricted bequest
- Restricted Giving, however, saw an increase of 16.9% with the largest variance in School Restricted Funds
- Tuition & Fees saw an increase of \$25K over the previous year; however grants awarded also increased by \$28K
- Fund Raising Revenue totaled over \$175K, with the largest fundraisers being the Auction, Dragon Raffle, & Walk-A-Thon
- Personnel costs increased by 4.1% over prior year -\$95K
- Supply Costs were reduced by 31% as COVID expenses waned

- Occupancy costs dropped by 11.2% which was a combination of increased Utility Costs (\$9K) and decreased Contracts and Repairs (\$45K)
- Capital Expenditures included Flooring Upgrades (\$9K); Painting (\$47K); Waterproofing / Water Damage Repairs (\$25K); Play Area / Retaining Wall (\$28.8K) Technology Upgrades (\$32K)
- Thank you to the parishioners who have signed up for online giving, company matching programs, and IRA contributions. These programs help the parish plan for ongoing expenses.
- 28 families received grants from the Today and Tomorrow Educational Foundation in the amount of \$76,346.
- 3 families received scholarships from the Mandeville

Scholarship Fund in the amount of \$9,277.

- 28 families received scholarships from St. Margaret of Scotland Parish in the amount of \$52,733.
- St. Margaret participated in our first-ever Giving Tuesday on November 29, 2022. Giving Tuesday is a day to promote and raise money for parishes and charities in the Archdiocese of St. Louis 53 people donated \$4915 (plus two \$500 prize awards) for the support of our Youth Ministry projects.
- St. Margaret continued to promote and fund the Mandeville Multicultural Scholarship fund, which provides funds for minority, non-Catholics students at our school. The PTA Trivia Night contributed \$13,124 to the Scholarship Fund, and our first-ever Parish Lenten Project raised \$7,397 for the fund.
